Classes: 3 all level and one intermediate class

Coiling supplies for purchase

Class A. Basic Spiral Stitch Coaster

Instructor: Jim Shanower (13 years coiling)

Skill Level: All Levels

Class Description: Beginning with a wooden base, the student will create a coaster while learning the basic interlocking spiral stitch and how to keep the stitch interval consistent and the coil size uniform using a gauge.

Required Tools: needle nosed pliers and a thimble can also be helpful.

Class B. Starting On A Cabochon Center

Instructor: Michele Morton (13 years coiling)

Skill Level: All Levels

Class Description: Learn how to begin a coiled project around a decorative centerpiece and add an additional design element by wrapping your coils. We will be stitching using the basic spiral stitch.

Required Tools: Small jeweler's pliers and small scissors. Or just share the ones that will be provided.

Class C. Wrapped River Rock

Instructor: Vicky Nickelson (50 years coiling)

Skill Level: All Levels

Class Description: A new twist on a Serenity Rock. Learn to wrap a ring using the double buttonhole stitch, using these rings to coil a medallion using pine needles, with the Wheat and Fern stitch. The Medallion is attached to the river rock with copper tape and embellished with beads.

Required Tools: small sharp scissors

Class D. The Peacock Stitch

Instructor: David Chambers (16 years coiling)

Skill Level: Must have completed at least 3 pine needle coiling projects. No exceptions please

Class Description: We will learn/practice the peacock stitch, as I call it, by coiling around a wooden center to make a coaster. We will coil with a gauge emphasizing stitch placement and neatness in order to create beautiful stitch patterns.

Required Tools: small sharp scissors and your favorite coiling tools Jan 2019
